Getting Started

Thank you for your interest in the Associate of Applied Science Criminal Justice Security and Loss Prevention Option Degree. This program prepares the student for entry into the field of police work and related occupations. Criminal justice vocations have evolved from jobs with minimal requirements to jobs requiring complex knowledge and skills. This curriculum gives the student theory, principles, and techniques employed by criminal justice agencies and police units. The study of the law as it relates to criminal justice agencies, human behavior, government, and communications along with specialized course work comprise the curriculum.

Graduates from the AAS in Criminal Justice program may seek job opportunities on the federal, state, county, and municipal levels.

With experience, the CJ graduate may move into administrative or supervisory positions in corrections, security and/or law enforcement.

Transfer Information

With a KCTCS Associate of Applied Science in Criminal Justice, Security and Loss Prevention Option, you may transfer this degree to University of Louisville and complete the Bachelor of Science Administration of Justice Degree completely online. These courses will also transfer to Eastern Kentucky University and Campbellsville University toward baccalaureate degrees in criminal justice.

Getting Started

Students may register for KCTCS online classes offered system wide directly at any KCTCS college. Individuals may also complete a “course inquiry” submit form through www.kyvc.org. KYVC course inquiries are submitted directly to the KCTCS Home College identified by the student. The student’s chosen Home College processes the course inquiry either through formal admission procedures or class enrollment. Security and Loss Prevention Competencies

Upon completion of this program, the graduate can:

1. Demonstrate an understanding of the nature, function, and scope of criminal justice ideas, issues, and programs,
2. Identify and demonstrate the abilities needed to supervise and manage various aspects of a police, corrections, or security and loss prevention agency,
3. Understand the issues and component parts of a police, corrections, or private security organization,
4. Identify and demonstrate the abilities needed to supervise and manage various aspects of a police agency,
5. Communicate effectively using standard written English,
6. Communicate in a clear oral and non-verbal fashion and employ active listening skills,
7. Demonstrate basic skills in computer operations and/or software applications,
8. Organize, analyze, and make information useful by employing mathematics,
9. Demonstrate an awareness of one’s interaction with the biological/physical environment,
10. Demonstrate an awareness of self as an individual, as a member of a multicultural society, and/or as a member of the world community,
11. Recognize the impact of decisive ideas and events in human heritage,
12. Develop and perform basic search strategies and access information in a variety of formats, print and non-print,
13. Analyze, summarize, and interpret a variety of reading materials,
14. Think critically and make connections in learning across the disciplines,
15. Elaborate upon knowledge to create new thoughts, processes, and/or products,
